According to the entry devoted to Moshe Perlmann in the *Encyclopaedia Judaica* (Jerusalem 1971, vol. 13, column 297, signed by the editor [ED.]), Perlmann published a two volume publication containing Talmudic statements on medicine (*Midrash ha-refu'ah: kolel kol torat ha-refu'ah u-shemirat ha-beri'ut ba-Talmud ha-Bavli vi-Yerushalmi, Mekhilta, Sifra, Sifre ve-Tosefta, Midrashim ve-Zohar, ve-khu' מדרש הרפואה כולל כל תורת הרפואה ושמירת הבריאות בתלמוד בבלי וירושלמי, מכילתא, ספרא, ספרי ותוספתא, מדרשים וזוהר וכו'*). This information is repeated in an enlarged, unsigned entry on “Perlmann, Moshe” in *Encyclopaedia Judaica. Second Edition*, London etc. 2007, vol. 15, p. 779. Perlmann’s authorship is most uncertain. No such work is listed in any of his extant CVs. Moreover, his son, Joel Perlmann, is also not aware of such a publication from his father’s pen and holds it to be most unlikely, given his scant interest in medicine.

The following distribution evolved (giving the pagination of the Būlāq edition) ... vol. III, 115–357 were translated by M. Perlmann, UCLA. ... The translations rested in various stages of progress for a number of years until preparatory work for publication was resumed when T. Philipp received a generous grant from the Fritz Thyssen Stiftung for this purpose in 1990. The individual translators had been left at great liberty as to how to proceed with their translations. Hence, the first task was it [sic] to standardize and integrate the different translations as much as possible with regard to transliterations, translations of specific terms, pagination etc. ... This translation project seems to have grown as we worked on it. The actual size of the task was probably underestimated by all. The sheer amount of material was staggering.”
