



MEMORANDUM TO CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS OF COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Subject: CASE Reporting System

On May 1, 1967, Dr. Donald Hornig, Chairman of the Federal Council for Science and Technology, issued a Special Notice to all colleges and universities announcing the commencement of a new Federal reporting system on academic science and engineering. The new system, which was developed by the Committee on Academic Science and Engineering (CASE), is called the CASE Reporting System. The objective of the new system is to obtain a carefully defined set of key data elements describing Federally supported academic science and engineering projects. These data will provide a needed information base upon which future policies and plans for Federal support of academic science and engineering programs may meaningfully be formulated.

In order to explain more fully the intent and purpose of this new system, three half-day regional meetings have been scheduled. A presentation of the CASE system will be made at each meeting and opportunity will be provided for questions. Each college and university desiring additional information on the CASE Reporting System is invited to send a representative to one of these regional meetings--whichever one is most convenient in terms of location or date.
