Veblen to Flexner (NYC):

"...

"...I wish now to raise the question whether the personal assistants to professors are included in the \$15,000 which is to be used for these appointments. If so, the fund is practically exhausted when we make allowance for Wilder and the three assistants."

Flexner to Veblen (Princ. Univ.):

"...

"I should not think the personal assistants to the professors ought to be included in the \$15,000 to be used for the grants in aid. This fund should be regarded as grants in aid to persons not officially connected with the Institute but rather as having permanent connections elsewhere. The Executive Committee appropriated \$1,500 for Dr. Torrance..."

Flexner to Morse, January 18, 1935.

"We are anxious to avoid regimentation and standardization and have thus far succeeded in doing so without creating the slightest tension, as far as I have been able to ascertain... perhaps you will not mind my calling attention to the peculiar situation of the professorial assistants. These are annual appointments, subject of course to renewal for a relatively brief period of years, for two reasons: (1) in order that, as soon as a young man is able to stand on his feet, he may go out and make a career for himself; (2) that, in order that those young men who have enjoyed close contact with the professorial group may after a time leave Princeton in order to improve the status of mathematical teaching and research throughout the country." He authorized Morse to offer Mr. Pitcher his mathematical assistant, either \$1,500 or \$1,800. The salary is quite low so as not to make it difficult for outside institutions to attract these men.

In confirmation of what Flexner had told Einstein by telephone: "You have the choice of your assistant absolutely in your own hands and...you are perfectly free to take on someone who has already been granted a stipend or a complete outsider, if you please, and in the choice of your assistant you have thus complete freedom. You do not need the consent of your associates or of my consent. If you would simply let me know whom you wish, Mrs. Bailey will send a formal letter so that the person in question understands ^{his} relationship to you. In previous years you have selected Rosen who also held a stipend, and he was made your assistant.

"Professor Mayer's case is entirely separate and it has no bearing whatsoever on anything you may wish to do in the future."
