Dear Dr. Kaysen:

Please forgive me for bothering you with a somewhat unusual inquiry.

I plan to go to Europe this summer, especially to Burgundy where I wish to make an attempt at tracing the vicissitudes of an important late-mediaeval tomb (that of Philippe Pot) now in the Louvre. But on the way to Burgundy I should like very much to stop for a time at Bonn and Freiburg in order to receive two little academic honors which these two universities unexpectedly decided to offer to me. Bonn wishes to confer upon me an Honorary Ph.D.; Freiburg - where I took my regular degree more than fifty years ago - wishes to make me an "Honorary Senator" because an honorary doctor's degree cannot be conferred upon one who has already acquired a regular degree at Freiburg University.

I should like very much to accept these well-intentioned invitations but find it difficult to meet the additional expenditure out of the modest pension which I receive from TIAA and CREF. Since Professors Emeriti do not, as a rule, receive travel allowances from the Institute, I should like to ask whether the Institute would be able and willing to grant me an exceptional subsidy of between \$1000 and \$1500 this year in view of the special circumstances involved. If so, I should be profoundly grateful; if not, I should perfectly understand that the acceptance of such an unusual request would set a precedent which the Institute might be reluctant to sanction.

Whatever your decision may be, I hope that I shall be forgiven for having raised the question.

Please forgive me for bothering you with two requests of a financial nature.

First, I should like to inform you that we plan to go to California this year instead of spending a straight vacation in Maine. One of our purposes is, of course, to escape from the Princeton heat for a while. The other, however, is to have a look at the California museums which I do not know at all and some of which contain paintings which are of special interest to me, including a genuine portrait by Titian. I wonder whether it would be proper to consider my trip as sufficiently "professional" to support it by the little rest of my travel allowance (I believe, \$250.00) which is not as yet used up.

Second, in view of the agreement, according to which the Institute will reimburse me for any increase in real estate taxes above the level of 1957 (then \$1000), I beg to inform you that this year's taxes, which I have already paid, amount to \$1114.72; so the Institute would seem to owe me \$114.72.
