D. degree, but with the exception of medicine and certain other branches, the country has not hitherto possessed an institution in which young men and women could continue their independent training beyong this stage, and in which research could be carried on with adequate

support without pressure of numbers or routing, and unberried by the meed of obtaining prestical results."

He said the reference to medicine embraced the Rockefeller Institute, "and to come extent similar facilities are available in a few medical schools." Dean Bisanhart's suggestion question that in the uture the Institute should enroll only post-doctoral students, therefore, harmonises with the statements which have been printed, although a few exceptions, not on reflection worthwille, have previously been made.

Pleaner was opposed to the multiplication of rules and regulations. He thinks that the question of importance attached to degrees is one which cannot be answered in such a way as to make sure that one is doing in every individual case the wisest possible thing. He cites Johns Ropkins as holding to the rule that admission is restricted to as holders of the A. B. Degree, though there were worthy persons equally fit to enter the school who hadnot yet obtained the degree. In the same way the Rockefeller Institute has followed the practice of admitting only persons who have obtained the H. D. Degree


