Neumann says that when Harvard University is faced with the necessity of making an appointment of a full professor from outside the University, a committee of askside qualified scholars in the field is appointed with the duty of examining the nomination made by the School or Department of Harvard. This ad hoc group considers not only the merits of the proposed appointment, but reviews the field to ascertain whether, in their judgment, a more qualified individual exists. They then report (question—to whom). This prevents inbreeding and too great specialization or limited viewpoint; it furnishes a mechanism for stymicing the full action of academic politics and logrolling.
