PRINCETON - Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, a principal architect of the atom bomb, has apparently changed his mind about staying on in Princeton following his retirement as director of the Institute for Advanced Study here, originally scheduled for June 30, 1966.

Oppenheimer, who announced last April that he would like to teach physics at the Institute after he retired, will instead join the scientific council of the newly-forming Center for Theoretical Studies at the University of Miami.

Yesterday Dr. Behram Kursunoglu, council chairman and director of the center, said that the council will meet January 18 in Coral Gables, Fla. to discuss principles for the center.

Oppenheimer was teaching theoretical physics at the University of California, Berkeley and the California Institute of Technology when he was tapped to head the Los Alamos atom bomb project in

He had returned to teaching after the war when he was appointed director of the Institute in the spring of 1947. He lives in a house at 97 Olden Lane on the Institute grounds.

Oppenheimer was the storm center of controversy in 1954 when the government revoked his security clearance because of suspected former Communist sympathies. His name was in effect cleared when he received the Enrico Fermi Award in 1962.
