Jacques Hadsmard, a great French mathematician who left France in 1942, apparently under some duress. Habii Stephen Wise, Arnold Dresden, Erakki Espaking, of Louis Hapakine of the Mockeföller Foundation, and others busied themselves in Madamard's interest. He was 75 years old, and therefore, not eligible for appointment in the Institute on a stipend basis. The Mockefeller Foundation found that under its rules, they could do nothing toward granting him funds, and, finally, the problem was resolved, apparently, by Jacob Billikopf approaching the Hosenwald Family Foundation, the Ittleson Foundation, and the Palcy Foundation. The filed does not reveal what ultimately was done. Hademard lectured at Columbia and at the Institute for small amounts of money,

In 1953 Sir Owen W. Richardson wrote Chester Arthur Grove. a technician in the physics laboratory from 1903-1953 when he was given a testimonial for 50 years service. He was the man who built the contraptions which the physicists needed for experiments. He was noted for his good human qualities. good humor, kindness, good cheer. Richardson recounts in this letter which is in a testimonial book to Grove how when he came to Princeton it was to install a research laboratory in the cellar of the old science building which had no ventilation but a big hole. The space was infested with hop toads which used the space and the swimming was pool nearby. In the letter he recounts his students, the Comtons, Davidson, C. J., who married Richardson's sister, and others. He said the faculty was very much interested in what Richardson was doing.
