
I have before me a copy of World Organization 1920-1940. The copy carries the notation that inquiries requesting further copies should be made to you.

## Special Class Planned at Y. W. After Holidays

---

"Building for the Future" is the subject of a study course to be sponsored by the Y. W. C. A. Public Affairs committee after the holidays. It will include study of plans for achieving "the goal beyond victory" from the viewpoints of religion, education, economics, political science and ideals of human betterment.

The group will meet in the Y. W. C. A. each Monday morning from 10 to 12 for a period of six weeks beginning Jan. 12. At the first meeting Mrs. O. G. Ellis will review efforts towards world organization during the past 100 years. Mrs. Roderick Olzendam will give a brief evaluation of the League of Nations and proposal for reorganization.

The course of study to be used is set up by a national commission sponsored by the American Association of University Women, the American Union for Concerted Peace Efforts, Church Peace Union, League of Nations association, National Board of Young Women's Christian associations and the World Citizens association. It will be supplemented with material from other organizations such as the League of Women Voters and the General Federation of Women's clubs.
