Meeting of the Nominating Committee

December 14, 1987

Present:

Messrs. Bradshaw (Chairman), Gregorian, and Miss McCormack. Also Messrs. Brown, Goldberger and Wolfensohn, and Mrs. Labalme.

Mr. Bradshaw opened the meeting at 2:10 p.m. by pointing out that with the resignation of John Akers this past year, Mrs. Delmas and Mr. Taplin in the spring of 1988, and Mr. Straus in the spring of 1989, a number of vacancies would exist on the Board which is presently at 19 members and could go as high as 25.

Mr. Wolfensohn pointed out that there are now few active CEO's on the Board and this element should be strengthened.

Mr. Gregorian remarked that the Institute had an international reputation and that its sights should be raised to distinguished international figures such as major statesmen or Nobel laureates. He also encouraged the Committee to renew its Philadelphia ties.

In the ensuing discussion, the following names were raised and discussed as potential Trustees:


