

Dear Allen:

Dear Harry,

I have just returned from a trip abroad to Israel; Zürich, Switzerland; and Oslo, Norway.

My stay was divided as follows: Israel, April 29 - May 15; Zürich, May 15 - May 26; and Oslo, May 26 - June 1st.

In Israel I lectured at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, the Weizmann Institute in Rehovoth and the Technion in Haifa. In addition, I addressed the annual meeting of the Israeli Mathematical Society held in Beersheva this year.

In Zürich I lectured at the ETH and also in the mathematical seminar run jointly by ETH and Zürich University.

In Oslo I lectured at the University of Oslo and also gave a speech in commemoration of Viggo Brun (a noted Norwegian mathematician who died last August at the age of 93) in the Norwegian Academy of Science.

Various lecture honoraria that I received essentially covered my living expenses as well as my travel expenses inside Israel (or more precisely: they would have if I had been alone and also used more public transportation instead of renting cars).

My ticket New York-Tel Aviv-Zürich-Oslo-New York cost \$949.25. With some other expenses such as getting to and from the airport, my unreimbursed expenses come to about \$1,000.00, which is the amount I would like to have refunded from my travel allowance.

Dear Mr. Morgan:

As I will be leaving shortly and not be back until January (unless something unforeseen should happen) I should like to have the following things attended to.


1. I need a withholding statement for a sailing permit (leaving July 6).
2. I would like to have the monthly withholding for federal income tax purposes increased to \$1,050 per month for the rest of the year.
3. I notice that I have forgotten to ask for reimbursement for expenses connected with attending (and lecturing at) the International Conference on Complex Analysis held at Jyväskylä, Finland, August 17-22, 1970.

My expenses, if I had gone alone and the direct way (in fact, I travelled in a much more complicated way and not alone), would have been, by a reasonable estimate:

Air fare, New York-Helsinki-New York, \$678. Additional travel (the stretches Princeton-Kennedy and Helsinki-Jyväskylä, each twice) at about \$25. Hotel and meals (arriving at Jyväskylä in the evening of August 16 and leaving in the afternoon on August 22, I did actually stay one day more there) about \$100.

This would total about \$800 which I would like to have reimbursed from my travel fund.


Dear Carl:

As the plans for my proposed trip in March this year, which we briefly have discussed before, now have become rather complete, I should like to give you some details.

I plan to leave on March 12 and to return on April 2. First I stay 10 days in Israel at the Weizmann Institute in Rehovoth, and will give one lecture there and one at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. Passing through Zürich, where I plan to see some colleagues, I go to Oberwolfach in Germany, where there will be a conference in number theory during the days March 25-31. My main purpose there, though I will give a lecture, is to look over some of the younger people from Western Europe working in the area of number theory and get an impression of them and of what they are doing currently. I believe this can be a great help in connection with the planning of the program in analytic number theory which our school has tentatively scheduled for the academic year 1970-71.

On my way back I make a one-day stop in Oslo. This has, however, no mathematical motivation or excuse.

This year I attended the international colloquium on the theory of analytic functions sponsored by the Academy of Sciences of the USSR and the International Mathematical Union, which was held September 6-14 in Erevan, Soviet-Armenia.

Hotel bills while in Erevan, and airline-tickets Moscow-Erevan-Moscow were paid by the Academy of Sciences of the USSR.

Dear Mr. Morgan,

As I mentioned to you earlier this week, I am finally getting around to making a claim for reimbursement for some of my travel expenses this summer.

I gave this summer lectures in Germany (in July) and in Oslo, Norway in the latter part of August. Essentially my hotel expenses in these places were covered by the honorarium received (or rather would have been, had I traveled alone). Towards the end of August I had to go to Stockholm for a few days to discuss some matters in connection with the scientific program for the International Congress of Mathematicians which is to be held there next year. I am as usual rather late in claiming a refund from my travel allowance, but at least I remembered to do it before the year ends.

While I was in Paris in May-June, I received from the Collège de France a compensation that would have covered the living expenses for the two months had I been alone.
