

# Moritz Steinschneider Correspondence at the JTSA (ARC. 108)

## An Inventory<sup>1</sup>

### Introductory note

The library of the Jewish Theological Seminary, New York, holds the Moritz Steinschneider Papers under the shelfmark ARC 108, consisting of correspondence, miscellaneous notes, research materials, offprints, catalogs etc. A brief overview of the contents of the 30 boxes is provided by the library at

file:///C:/Users/scs/Downloads/424456\_Steinschneider\_5-5-16.html.shtml, allowing but a glimpse into this important collection. To the best of my knowledge, the Moritz Steinschneider Papers were only consulted up until now by Alexander Marx,<sup>2</sup> Marie Louise Steinschneider,<sup>3</sup> Ismar Schorsch,<sup>4</sup> Asher Salah,<sup>5</sup> and the present author.<sup>6</sup> Between 2-5 October 2023, the present writer together with Reimund Leicht visited the JTS library and consulted the entire Moritz Steinschneider Papers with the aim of preparing a detailed inventory of the materials they include.<sup>7</sup> The present dataset constitutes a preliminary result, listing all of Steinschneider's correspondents in alphabetical order.

The correspondence that is found among the Moritz Steinschneider Papers consists of letters and postcards Steinschneider had received since the 1840s until his death on 24 January 1907. While Steinschneider did not keep copies of his own correspondence to others, he noted, in red ink, on the letters and postcards he had received the dates when he had responded to them. Moreover, Steinschneider recorded his correspondence from 1855 through 1907 in three small notebooks, whose entries, arranged according to year, month, and day, list the letters and postcards he received and replied to on each day. They also indicate the dates given on the letters sent to him. The notebooks are preserved at the JTSA in New York, Moritz Steinschneider Papers, ARC. 108, Collection Postcards. The Moritz Steinschneider Papers also include some documentation relating to the transfer of Steinschneider's *Nachlass* to the JTS.

Steinschneider's library, together with some documentary material including correspondence, was donated to the library of the JTS after his

death. The letters and postcards that were included among this material (presumably stuck into the books) is found today for the most part in boxes 11a and 11b that are labeled “Correspondence unsorted, A–Z”. Significant portions of the correspondence are also found in boxes 14b through 22 that otherwise primarily include unpublished handwritten research materials. Steinschneider’s epistolary exchange with Auguste Auerbach, his later wife, remained in the possession of the family and was sold in 1932 by Gustav Steinschneider to the JTS.<sup>8</sup> The bulk of Steinschneider’s correspondence was kept after his death by Adeline Goldberg (1858–1942), Steinschneider’s research assistant for several years in the last two decades of his life.<sup>9</sup> Goldberg compiled an inventory of correspondents (*Verzeichnis der Correspondenten, Briefe und Karten*) that is kept in box 16 of the Moritz Steinschneider Papers. Goldberg’s *Verzeichnis* provides a first orientation but is by no means exhaustive. Moreover, she notes for the most part only the last name of the correspondents, adding only rarely their first name or initial. The material Goldberg had kept after

1907 was transferred to the JTS in 1935. The letters were arranged in alphabetical order and are kept today in boxes 1 through 14c, although some authors of these letters were not correctly identified and some letters are simply misplaced. Additionally, the majority of postcards Steinschneider had received are kept in a separate box, containing three rows of postcards, as well as the above-mentioned notebooks in which Steinschneider recorded his correspondence.

The aim of the present inventory is to provide a first comprehensive overview of those from whom Steinschneider received letters that are included today among the Moritz Steinschneider Papers. Since the material is still largely in disorder, letters and postcards from the persons listed below are found in numerous locations of the *Nachlass*. A detailed description of the contents of boxes 14b through 22 will be given at a later point by Reimund Leicht, to complement the present inventory. Names that are rendered in green could be verified, names rendered in purple might refer to the same person.
